Education

- Prepares students for corporate America.
- Develops an appreciation of entrepreneurship and the benefits of continuing education.
- Prepares members for their futures at work and college.

Progress

- Explore the local, state, and national levels of FBLA.
- Focus on activities that promote FBLA at the local, regional/district, state, and national levels.



BAA LEVELS

- BAAs have a total of 4 levels
- You need to achieve the levels in order from Future to America
- Each level gets progressively harder
- For every level achieved receive a BAA pin
- You can do multiple levels in one year!

FUTURE LEVEL

- Complete 10 activities total
- 6 are required, 4 are of your choosing
- Pins presented at a local awards ceremony or FBLA event by adviser

Deadline: March 1

- Basic business skills
- Introduction to community service
- Emphasizing FBLA involvement

BUSINESS LEVEL



- Complete 12 activities total
- 5 are required, 7 are of your choosing
- Pins presented at a local awards ceremony or FBLA event by adviser

- Local, regional, and state FBLA involvement
- Developing intermediate business skills
- Community Leadership



LEADER LEVEL

- Complete 14 activities total
- 8 are required, 6 are of your choosing
- Pins presented at State Business Leadership Conference

- Local, regional, state, and national FBLA involvement
- Developing advanced business skills
- Becoming Community Leaders



AMERICA LEVEL

- Complete 15 activities total
- 9 are required, 6 are of your choosing
- Pins presented at the National Leadership Conference

- FBLA leadership at all levels
- Hone advanced business skills
- Instills spirit of community involvement





Adviser Role

- 1. Log into the Chapter Membership Record
- 2. Click on National Programs
- 3. Go to View Students for BAA
- 4. Click on the award level button under the name of the student you want to register
- 5. You will receive a URL to the student portal

Student Role
