



WHAT IS A HACK?

Great Solutions Start with Great Problems

A good problem statement is:

- concise
- info rich
- include metrics

REMEMBER:

a good problem statement doesn't include a solution...that comes later!



What Makes a "Good" Problem Statement?

A good problem statement should answer questions such as:


- What is the problem?
- Who has the problem?
- Where does the problem occur?
- When does the problem occur?
- How often does the problem occur?
- What causes the problem?
- What is the impact of the problem?






